Decision to increase the price of the County Ticket (including for FESEN provision provided by SCC) - Somerset County Council's Further Education student Bus Pass for the 2018/19 academic year	6 June 2018 by the Cabinet Member for Education and Council Transformation and the Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport	SUMMARY OF DECISION: The County Ticket is an annual ticket available for further education students to enable access to colleges across Somerset. The ticket can be used across the public transport network and on some contracted routes for FESEN students and those attending schools with a sixth form provision where there is no public transport provision in place. The price of the ticket is negotiated with the bus operator on an annual basis and is dependent on their costs in providing the service. Transport Inflation in the last year was 8.3% and continues to rise therefore the operators cannot continue to operate the County Ticket without a price increase. This decision increased the cost of the County Ticket (including FESEN tickets) from £695 to £795. ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED: As set out in the officer report.

Somerset Specialist All Age Drug and Alcohol Treatment Service contract award	9 July 2018 by Cabinet	SUMMARY OF DECISION: Somerset County Council Public Health commission the drug and alcohol treatment service for all ages. The current contract for this service area is due to expire 31st March 2019. Somerset County Council receives £4,191,000 through the Public Health grant for the provision of drug and alcohol specialist treatment services for the population. In addition, the Somerset County Council revenue budget currently contributes £400,200 to the service. There has been a year on year planned reduction through the Medium Term Financial Plan to reduce the County Council contribution and in 2019/20 the final element of these planned savings will accrue to Somerset County Council as a result of efficiencies achieved through this procurement process. To safely accommodate these savings the decision was made to tender for a service against a new specification and performance framework. This opportunity has reshaped the service model to achieve maximum efficiency and best outcome. Evidence reviews and scoping have been undertaken and a period of engagement and consultation including with services users and peer mentors has taken place.
