Purpose of the Report

To consider funding towards a new heating and hot water system for the scout headquarters.

Recommendation

That members agree an award of £3,000 from the revenue grants budget.

Background

St Andrews Scout Group is a popular organisation that was established in 1930. The group opened a new section in the last year to accommodate the high number of young people that were on their waiting list.

The group has approximately one hundred young members and these members actively raise funds for both the organisation and for local charities.

Project

The heating and hot water system installed at the scout headquarters is no longer adequate and there is no hot water in the toilets. The lack of adequate heating during particularly cold weather means there is a risk that the scout sections would not be able to meet. This would be a great shame for the young members who enjoy taking part in the activities.

In addition, the scout group has equipment that would deteriorate if the building were left cold and damp.

The hut is also used by district scouts for training and the church also hire it for their youth group. It would be a shame if these important activities were not able to take place due to the lack of sufficient heating.

The group has been actively fundraising for the project and it is recommended that financial support be given to enable the popular activities to continue within a warmer more comfortable environment. Fundraising has included summer fairs, bag packing at supermarkets, raffles and bingo.

Ward Members Comments

A ward member is very supportive of the application. The group are a very busy and inclusive scout group and have a very good track record for fundraising.
