Thank you for notification of this matter. I much regret I may be unable to attend the meeting of the Regulation Committee on 16<sup>th</sup> July. I would wish to draw attention to the Rubic dismay that the old quarry site on Elsome Road is the only one that the County Council could afford to buy for the long-awaited new primary school in Somerton!

I must cautiously accept that my deep concerns relating to pupil safety on site have now been resolved, so that the Head Teacher is confident on this matter.

I remain dismayed that the Highways Officers still consider the area of Elsome/Cony Way/Highped as being "left traffic". This I believe to be wrong.

In order to make the school journey less dangerous; Cony Way must be made wider, by using the verge to the North side of the road. The junction with Elsome Road, already very dangerous, should be amended so that motor traffic does not turn right into

over

Northfield.

I trust that following a review, the surface water storage on this site, will now be put under ground. This will free up a little extra green surface area to the front of the school.
