Item 5: **Public Question Time**

How do LCNs work in other councils?

It was confirmed that the rolling out of LCNs in other councils, such as Wiltshire, Cornwall and Buckinghamshire have been successful and Somerset have built on the learning from their experiences.

A further question was raised regarding Allocated funding for LCN's.

Councillor Keitch explained that in another Council where pots of money, where specifically allocated, the LCN merely became a grant making body. She pointed out that the Somerset LCNs wanted to avoid that and therefore the Council would not be allocating individual pots of money to each LCN at the current time

As LCN identify and develop their priorities there may be a need to identify funding sources to support the delivery of actions however we have seen in the pilots that this funding could come from an array of sources.

She further pointed out that the LCNs were set up by Somerset council for each LCN to decide what they needed and have a voice within the council.

Item 6: **To determine the priorities and areas of focus for the Local Community Network for the next 12 months**

Item 6a: **What are LCNs and how will we work together**

Kate Hellard (Service Manager LCN) shared a presentation on the purpose of the LCN and how it would feed back into the work of Somerset Council.

The meeting noted there was a dedicated page on the Somerset Council website at [Local Community Networks \(LCNs\) \(somerset.gov.uk\)](https://www.somerset.gov.uk/local-community-networks-lcns) and a contact officer could be contacted on lcn@somerset.gov.uk.

Attendees were asked to share what themes, issues and opportunities they wanted the LCN to explore over the next 12 months. The questions they needed to keep in mind whilst doing this were:

What topics are important to our residents?

How do we know?

What data/evidence/information would help?

What could be done to solve/improve topics?

Are there local examples already working?

Who do we need to involve?

Who else could be in the room (partners and stakeholders)?

Item 6b: **Discussion - What is important to residents and businesses in our area? An opportunity to raise any local issues or concerns for LCN to consider**

During the group discussions the Local Community Network (LCN) members highlighted the following as priorities for their area:

- Rural broadband speeds
- Community Infrastructure
- Roads, maintenance of
 - Cycle routes

- Footpaths
 - Glastonbury to Wells following the A39
 - Survey of existing & wanted paths
 - Safe walking
- Car parking
- Noise pollution
- Bottle necks
- A39 relief road
- Highways
- Pedestrian crossing on the A361 in West Pennard
- pavements
- Speed
 - Special cameras
 - More funding
 - 20mph (incl. visible signs)
 - Can also be shared across villages
 - Ability to have some say in speed limits
- Transport
 - Frequency and more services
 - More busses
 - Cost post £2
 - The 126 route – Strode college
 - Glastonbury, Bridgwater connections
 - Make sure it connects with villages
 - Evening and night travel
- Youth services and support
 - Education
 - Work
 - More activities/play parks
 - West Pennard would like a park
 - Public space to meet eg hall
 - Meare doesn't have a Village Hall
- Adult social care
 - Lobby govt for funding
 - Social contact
 - Can we get rural isolation data
- Traveller sites
 - They are doing illegal development,
 - Their planning applications being quickly accepted whereas others haven't been.

- Planning/development/infrastructure– general across the LCN
 - When will the local plans be confirmed?
 - Local and neighbourhood plans
 - Standardise SW106 & CIL
 - Enforcement Officers and feed back
 - Yurts, Shepherds Huts no planning permission
 - Understanding of planning decisions and how they are made
 - Feedback vital
 - Affordable housing – pref. Social grant (some 100% not 30%)
 - Sedgemoor housing could not offer better help
 - New housing
- Mobile libraries and other accessible to affordable services
- Health
 - Surgeries
 - Dentists
 - Chemist availability
- Environmental concerns
 - Phosphates & mitigation
 - Litter
 - Grass cutting
 - Fly tipping
 - Waste sites need to be open more and would be cost effective not to charge because it costs more to deal with fly tipping
 - Dog waste
 - Parishes sharing good practice with Somerset wildlife trust
 - Parishes sharing good practice within and without the LCN
 - Ensure fair representation across the whole LCN
 - Make sure villages receive their fair share of resources
 - Climate emergency related support

Other priorities, which were captured on flipchart paper included:

- Is there an LCN neighbourhood plan?
- Libraries/services
- Banking
- Communications to Parish Clerks
 - Who can help on certain topics
 - Shared data knowledge base
 - Pool resources/cost effective measures
- Police and their partners
 - Police divisions represented
- NHS
- Head teachers
- Shortage of trades for building
- Cost of living
- Farming community is important
- Housing
- Cultural life

Things that have been done to help included:

- Local parish survey has taken place to help identify issues in the area. (LCN to receive a copy of outcomes.)
- Recently taken a section on the playing field in Cossington and planted a small woodland area.

It was suggested that the following people be invited to the next LCN:

Item 7: To agree the frequency of meetings

It was discussed setting up sub-groups.

The LCN agreed that the next meeting would be scheduled for late September/October, due to the summer holidays.

Meanwhile, it was discussed that the meetings would possibly be monthly after that at first, going to bi-monthly as time went on.
