## Description of what is being impact assessed

### **Devolution of services to Bridgwater Town Council (BTC)**

The following services will be devolved to BTC. Both BTC and SC are working towards a handover date of the **operations** by 1<sup>st</sup> May 2024. Asset transfers will follow.

Grounds maintenance, cleansing and development of Parks, including

- Mansfield Park
- St Matthews fair and field
- Blake Gardens
- Victoria Park
- Eastover Park / Cranleigh Gardens
- King Square
- Bedding planting
- Management and maintenance of open spaces assets including both green spaces as well as "hard" open spaces
- Grass cutting and open spaces management
- Grass cutting in Wembdon Road Cemetery and St Mary's Church, however responsibility and maintenance of paths and walls will rest with Somerset Council

Events and other spaces\*, including;

- West Street market (part of the fair)
- Roller-Coaster
- The docks and associated public Realm (transfer in 25/26)

#### Street cleansing

- Street Cleaning across Bridgwater including highway channels and litter removal from verges
- Provision and collection of litter bins and dog waste bins
- Carnival clean-up
- Weed treatment
- Road sweeping

#### **Public toilets**

• Blake Gardens' toilets (operations, not assets from 1st May 2024)

#### Play Parks

• Play Parks (maintenance, development and Inspection from May 2024)

Somerset budget consultation <u>Budget Consultation 2024/2025 - Somerset Council - Citizen Space</u>- local services and outdoor spaces are important to the community, no likely difference to the Bridgwater community, devolving services to BTC is a way of protecting those services for the community, quotes include:

' Offload certain areas to town councils, devolved responsibilities where town councils can increase council tax by a larger amounts' ';Give money and autonomy to town councils to keep towns and villages maintained'

Overall SC is expecting no impacts to protected groups, and it is hoped that given the enhanced cleansing and grounds work BTC are planning to deliver – there will be positive impacts to the wider community, including protected groups as part of this service devolution – no services are being stopped as part of this process.

During the devolution process SC have been working hard with BTC to understand the services they are willing to take on, BTC is a well established TC and have the structure and organisation in place to take on these services.
