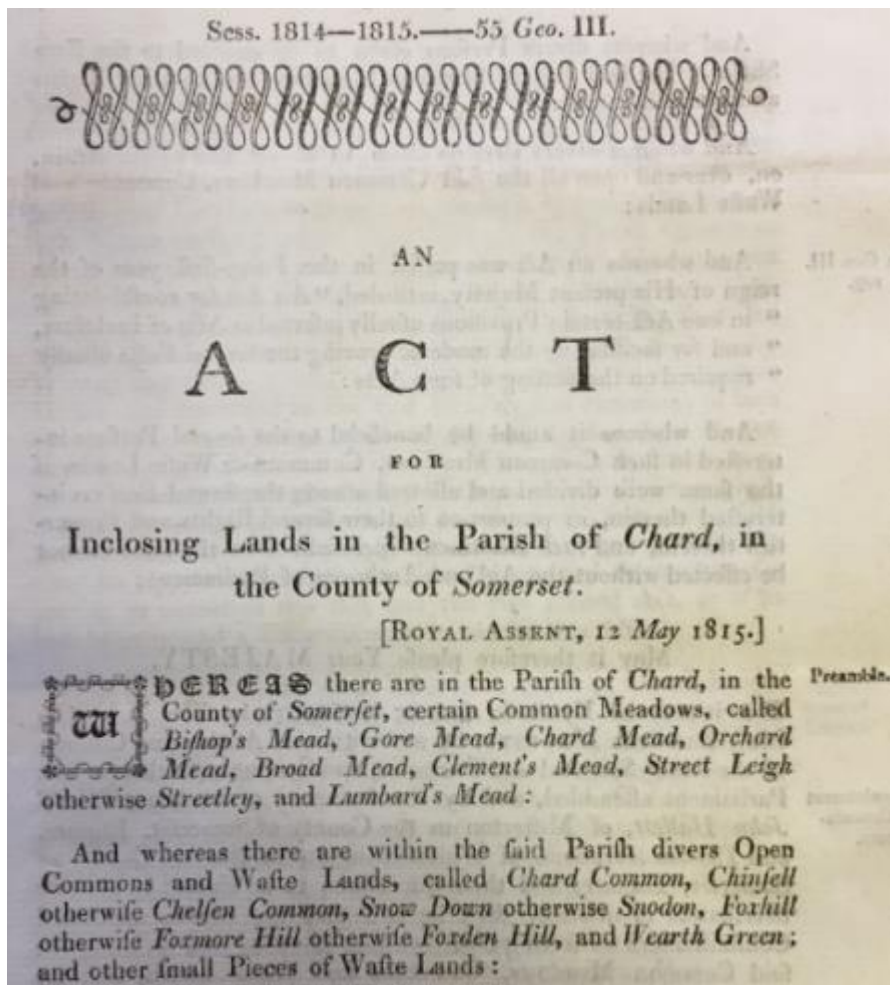
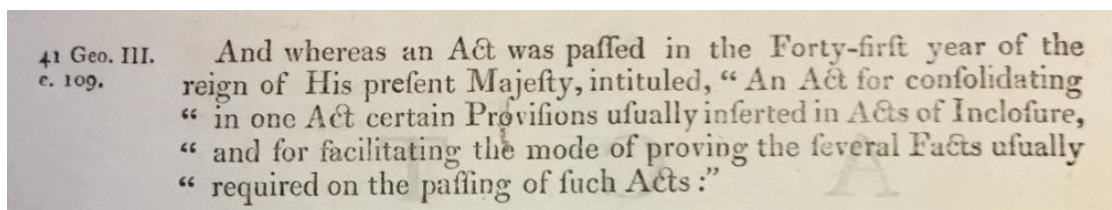


Appendix 5. Chard Inclosure Act, 1815.

Appendix 5, continued.

Commissioners may alter Roads through Inclosures.

And be it further Enacted, That in case it shall appear to the said Commissioners that there are or is any public Highways or Highway, Bridle Roads or Bridle Road, Footways or Footway, or other Road or Roads, Way or Ways, Path or Paths, in, through, over or upon any of the Lands directed to be inclosed, or other Lands within the said Parish, which may in their judgment be diverted or turned, without inconvenience to the Public, into any other public Highways or Highway, Bridle Roads or Bridle Road, Footways or Footway, or other Road or Roads, Way or Ways, Path or Paths, or be diverted or turned, so as to make the same more convenient to the Public, or be stopped up and destroyed as superfluous and unnecessary, it shall be lawful for them with the Concurrence and Order of Two Justices of the Peace acting in and for the said County of *Somerset*, not being interested in the said Inclosure,

Inclosure, and in the manner and subject to Appeal as in this or the said recited Act is mentioned, in and by their Award to order and direct such public Highways or Highway, Bridle Roads or Bridle Road, Footways or Footway, or other Road or Roads, Way or Ways, Path or Paths, to be altered, turned, stopped or discontinued, in such manner as the said Justices shall think proper.
