#### 1.0 Preamble

- 1.1.1 Jubb has been commissioned to provide highways and transport advice in relation to a planning application for the introduction of a proposed Southern Boulevard for use by pedestrians and cyclists on land located between Canal Road and the River Tone in Taunton. This proposal forms part of a wider mixed use regeneration proposal within the Town Centre, known as Firepool, comprising the former Taunton Cattle Market and surfaced car parks, situated to the east of Priory Bridge Road and bordering the River Tone.




Figure 1.1 Southern Boulevard site plan

- 1.1.2 **Figure 1.1** below sets out the proposed Southern Boulevard in the context of the current proposals for the wider Firepool masterplan. This diagram is also included as **Appendix A** of this Technical Note (TN).

1.1.3 The proposed Southern Boulevard proposals will provide a core north south walking and cycling connection that will assist in the creation of a dedicated pedestrian and cycle corridor from Taunton Train Station (in conjunction with the Northern Boulevard forming part of the consented Block 3 works) to the Tone Riverside Path. Furthermore, the east west route along the river would also facilitate onwards connection to Taunton town centre and other local destinations.

- 1.1.4 Following pre-application consultation with the Local Highway Authority (LHA), the cycle route assessment as set out in this TN has been developed at the LHA's request to set out how the proposals, in conjunction with the evolving wider Firepool masterplan, would complement the existing town network and further enhance connections to key destinations within Taunton.
- 1.1.5 The TN is therefore structured as follows:

**Section 2**: Outlines the key existing cycle infrastructure external to the proposals in the local vicinity to provide an associated context for the Southern Boulevard proposals;

**Section 3**: Sets out how the access strategy of the Southern Boulevard proposals will provide a central key north south cycle link, as well as a suitably located east west link to the south;

**Section 4**: Provides details of the routes both between the site and through the site to key destinations in order to set out how the Southern Boulevard proposals would assist with these linkages.

- 1.1.6 In addition, an associated summary and conclusion is also set out in **Section 5**.
- 1.1.7 It is noted that details setting out how the proposals would enhance pedestrian connectivity are set out in the Design and Access Statement.

#### 2.0 External Cycle Infrastructure Provision




Figure 2.1 Existing Cycle Provision - Abstract from SCC Taunton Cycling Map (Key included in full plan within Appendix B)

2.1.1 Taunton benefits from a fairly extensive cycle network with high permeability throughout the town centre area in a combination of on-road cycle lanes, traffic-free cycle paths and advisory cycle routes that were knitted together by National Cycle Route 3 (NCN 3). The site is well situated in relation to the local cycle network with a number of cycle routes close to the site that offer a range of cycling opportunities including connections to Taunton Town Centre and Public Transport Hubs. Details of local cycle provision have been extracted from the Somerset County Council (SCC) web site and are shown in **Figure 2.1** with full details included as **Appendix B**.

- 2.1.2 NCN 3, which runs through the site at the northern banks of the River Tone, offers a 'traffic-free' route to Priorswood Industrial Estate to the east and Taunton Town Centre to the southwest. As part of the proposals the existing towpath along the northern embankment of the River Tone will be improved and incorporated into the Riverside pedestrian/cycle route that will accommodate NCN 3 facilitating an east-west pedestrian and cyclist corridor. Details of this are provided in **Section 3** below.
- 2.1.3 Extending westwards, NCN 3 runs under Priory Bridge Road before crossing the River Tone at an existing pedestrian/cycle bridge to the northwest of Somerset County Cricket Ground and feeding into the pedestrian and cycling route along the southern embankment of the River Tone. Continuing westwards, the traffic free route then provides pedestrian and cyclists connection to the pedestrian shopping zone along St James Street before connecting onto the on-road cycle provision along The Bridge.
- 2.1.4 Running in a north south direction, the on-road cycle track along The Bridge affords the primary cycle link into Taunton town centre. Along the route, it joins together the traffic free cycleways, advisory cycle routes and on road provision along the side roads and River Tone offering onwards connection to the western areas of Taunton.
- 2.1.5 A shared use pathway can also be accessed along the southern side of Trenchard Way. Running in an east west alignment this route facilitates continuous cycling connection to Belvedere Trading Estate in the west, and linkage to NCN 3 to the east. An existing Toucan crossing is also located on Trenchard Way which provides a connection from the Trenchard Way cycle route to the Station access road on the northern side of the road.

- 2.1.6 In addition, the site is surrounded by a number of on-road and 'traffic-free' cycle routes that spur off NCN Route 3 facilitating onwards cycle connections to the nearby residential, retail, employment and leisure destinations in the local area.
- 2.1.7 It is also noted that the recent consent at Block 3 to the north will also introduce linkages between Canal Road and Trenchard Way. The proposals will therefore serve to extend this desire line to the south to link with the River Tone.

### 3.0 Internal Cycle Provision

- 3.1.1 In order to ensure the safety, attractiveness and accessibility of cycle movement the following infrastructure provisions are proposed as part of the Southern Boulevard proposals:
  - Pedestrian and cycleways will be provided through the Southern Boulevard between Canal Road and the proposed east west cycle routes on the River Tone. This will be a mixture of segregated routes where possible with some shared spaces at crossing points and key destinations such as the Town Square and around the Amphitheatre area.
  - NCN 3, which passes through the existing site, will be retained and enhanced along the river front. On the northern side of the River Tone, the existing towpath through the southern half of the proposals will be upgraded to an improved shared pedestrian-cycle route that will accommodate NCN 3 in an east-west direction.




Figure 3.1 Proposed cycle connections through Southern Boulevard proposals (current wider Firepool Masterplan included for further context)

- 3.1.2 **Figure 3.1** (also included as **Appendix C**) provides details as to how the Southern Boulevard proposals in conjunction with the wider Firepool masterplan would facilitate connection with the wider cycle network discussed in **Section 2**.

### 4.0 Links to External Destinations




Figure 4.1 Proposed cycle connections to wider destinations (current wider Firepool Masterplan included for further context)

4.1.1 Figure 4.1 (also included as Appendix D) below sets out the key routes that link with nearby destinations in the area in consideration of the advised SCC cycle routes as set out in Figure 2.1. In addition, Table 4.1 provides details of the cycle distances to and from the centre of Firepool via these routes and in consideration of the Southern Boulevard proposals, with journey time also identified based on a typical cycle journey time of 240m every minute.

4.1.2 As can be seen above, all of the identified key destinations can be reached within a short bike journey of 10-minutes or less. In addition, a cycle journey of approximately 4 minutes from Taunton's Railway Station to Taunton's main shopping area can also be delivered through the internal cycle network. Thus, it is considered that the proposed cycle strategy as set out for the Southern Boulevard is both appropriate in terms of local context and in terms of wider strategic context within the town.

### 5.0 Summary

5.1.1 The analysis as set out within this TN demonstrates how the proposed Southern Boulevard development will serve to complement existing cycle routes in the area to facilitate convenient journey times to and from the immediate locality. In addition, the proposals also provide a convenient route enabling enhanced connection between Taunton Railway Station and Taunton's main shopping area that would therefore serve to improve cycle connectivity through the centre for visitors to the town. Routes proposed include primary routes to allow cyclists to traverse through the network in a quick and efficient manner (i.e. for journeys through Firepool) and secondary leisure routes that link with the various proposed uses within Firepool. Thus, it is considered that the proposed cycle strategy as set out for the Southern Boulevard is both appropriate in terms of local context and in terms of wider strategic context within the town.





Taunton

Located in a valley between the Quantock and Blackdown Hills (both designated Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty), Taunton, the County Town of Somerset, is steeped in history and is home to an array of splendid historical attractions.

Especially worthy of note are the 12th century Taunton Castle, which houses the Museum of Somerset, and the Parish Church of St Mary Magdalene Church with its impressive 163ft tower. These, and many other buildings of historical interest, can be found by following the Taunton Heritage Trail.

Taunton holds a varied mix of cultural and musical events throughout the year. The popular Brewhouse Theatre &Arts Centre presents a wide ranging programme and the CICCIC Creative Innovation Centre is a venue for diverse music, arts and workshops.



## Our campaign to enable more cycling

We launched the 'Turn the network blue' campaign in 2019. The aim is to invest so that the red and amber routes (poor and substandard) in the Taunton Cycling network map become blue (better quality routes) so that everywhere locally is easily connected by bike.





Nearly 2000 people signed our petition asking Somerset West and Taunton Council and Somerset County Council o adopt it. The former have the map as part of their plans, whilst SCC has produced a 'Cycling and Walking nfrastructure Plan' which includes some of the priority routes. Both local authorities have made bids for funding for some parts of the network.


