Highlights from Yearly Report

- Initial meetings/formation of the Roads & Transport working group
- Initial meeting of the Flooding working group
- Active Travel – mapping of footpaths
- Speakers and discussions re Loneliness and isolation, deprivation and illegal gatherings

Next steps and outstanding actions

- Increase officer support for the LCN through dedicated Link Worker
- Organise the next flooding / emergency planning workshop
- Increase participation in working group activity
- Organise interim Highways working group meeting and schedule meetings with Highways colleagues.

LCN Highlights – Children and Young People

Taunton **Young People's** working group

- Collaborative networking group of organisations working with CYP
- Development of new free training for volunteers who work with CYP delivered by Somerset Youth Alliance
- New Safe Spaces in Taunton and Yeovil supported by collaborative working with SASP and MIND
- Taunton Minster supported by Somerset Youth Alliance with new working model to deliver young peoples space
- Violence Reduction Unit now funding Young Somerset to deliver walking hub sessions in Taunton McDonalds and Coffee #1 Bridgwater

Other LCNs have facilitated Children and Young People Working Groups, bringing a wide range of statutory and VCFSE partners together, supporting and enabling the delivery and development of local action plans to fill gaps in local services and meet local need.

LCN Highlights – Highways and Traffic

Exmoor Pilot LCN – **Highways and Traffic Working group**

- Significantly improved communications between SC and the parishes regarding planned work on the Highways Network – with regular meetings informing the planning of works around local events and business priorities.
- Delivery of a major capital project which involved a 5 month road closure on Exmoor through a cooperative approach to planning and delivery through the facilitation of the LCN bringing the project delivery in ahead of schedule and with a positive community response.
- Almost all LCNs (with the exception of Bridgwater and Taunton to date) have now had their initial Highways and Traffic working group with very positive feedback received in main LCN meetings.

LCN Highlights – Flooding and Emergency Planning

Delivery of **Flooding and Community Resilience workshops** across many LCN areas has significantly increased the number of City, Town and Parish Councils who now have up to date and realistic Emergency Plans.

These plans have been developed in collaboration with neighbouring parishes improving the experience of residents and reducing risks across communities.

LCN Highlights – Active Travel

LCNs including Bridgwater and Levels and Moors have **Active Travel Working groups** delivering a series of actions :

- New and extended active travel and multi user routes
- Development of new Active Travel Hub in Bridgwater
- Links between Colleges and local campaigns and groups
- New Bike workshops
- Planning for extended Bikability courses

LCN Highlights – Other

LCNs are also considering how to address issues and topics including Health and Wellbeing, Housing, Economic Development, Support for businesses and Climate, Environment and Conservation.

Many LCNs have facilitated local conversations about local topics with guest speakers discussing significant projects and local issues including bus services, illegal raves, road safety and the Tone Dale Mill project.
