Strategic Outcomes and reporting measures: Update

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<p>Summary:</p>	<p>The enclosed paper provides members with an update on the progress to develop strategic outcomes for the Integrated Care System.</p> <p>Board members were engaged in the development of the outcomes and measures through a workshop earlier in the year. The paper summarises the current state, the timeline for refining the measures, and publication of the initial scorecard.</p>
<p>Recommendations:</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. That the Somerset Board comments on the focus on Healthy Life Expectancy, subject to it being worked up as a stretch ambition, and acknowledging the need to stress the importance of reducing health inequalities to improving healthy life expectancy. 2. The board is asked to note the current long-list of sub-measures that will be revised during the forthcoming planning period (Jan-Mar 25) before inclusion within the scorecard.
<p>Reasons for recommendations:</p>	<p>To enable the detailed work-up on the Healthy Life Expectancy outcome to take place. This will see it develop into an ambition for the system (for e.g. <i>To improve the years spent in good health of residents from X to Y over the next Z years</i>).</p>
