# **Elections Fees and Charges**

#### 1. Summary

1.1 The Council has now assumed responsibility for the running of various election types which were previously run by the four district councils. It is prudent to put in place scales of fees and charges to provide certainty to the Returning Officer as to the level of payments to staff and to pay the proper charges for stationary, hire of building and other costs.

### 2. Recommendations

2.1 That Council note the report and approve the fees and charges to apply the various elections in Somerset for 2023/4 set out in the Appendices to the report.

#### 3. Electoral Fees and Charges

3.1 There are a number of election types which are relevant to Somerset. The main ones are set out in the table below together with the funding body in each case. Whenever there is an election or poll for each of these the Returning Officer, irrespective of title, is personally liable for the electoral process. The Council ensures that there is sufficient insurance in place to cover any issues that may arise at an election/poll.

The Electoral Registration Officer for the authority, and not the Returning Officer, is the relevant person who is appointed to be the Acting Returning Officer for Parliamentary Elections and the Petition Officer in respect of recall petitions. The funding in both cases comes from central government.

Legislation requires that each relevant local authority must place the services of its officers at the disposal of the person who is appointed to the office of returning officer (or the equivalent).

Although local elections are the responsibility of the Returning Officer, it is considered prudent for local authorities to have a scale of fees and charges to cover disbursements including fees to staff involved. Where a local authority has such a scale the Returning Officer can pay all expenditure properly incurred, provided that it does not exceed the fixed level. This provides certainty to both the authority and the Returning Officer. The predecessor authority approved a scale in February 2022 for the elections in May 2022. However, with the additional responsibilities for polling station staff, the effect of inflation and the increase in the national minimum wage, it is suggested that this scale should be amended for the current year. Please see Appendix A for the recommended levels. There are, however, savings from the previous scale as the Council no longer has to re-imburse district councils for the use of polling screens and election equipment.

The Chief Executive was appointed as the Returning Officer for Somerset Council elections on their initial appointment and their fees were incorporated into their overall salary level. The Chief Executive was subsequently appointed for other local election types as part of the Council's constitution which was adopted on 22 March this year. They are entitled to receive fees for these additional election types in common with the normal practice.

Regarding national election types, the Acting or Local Returning Officer receives fees determined by Parliament. It is at the Acting/Local Returning Officer's discretion if they wish to make any payments from those sums to deputies that they may appoint. Fees for staff at national elections are also to be set locally but within centrally recommended guidelines.

A suggested fee scales for City, Town and Parish Council elections is attached as Appendix B. This largely mirrors the Somerset Council scheme.

A suggested scale for Parish Polls is attached as Appendix C. Voting at Parish Polls is only held between 4 and 9pm, there are no poll cards or postal votes, which is why the scale is shorter than others. There is also no requirement for voters to show identity documentation at parish polls. These are comparatively rare occurrences, but for that reason, it is helpful to have a defined scale.

The scale for Neighbourhood Planning Referendums will be the same as for Somerset Council elections.

#### 4. Consultations undertaken

4.1 These have been internal with key officers including to ensure legal and administrative requirements are met. Comparisons have also been made with the fee scale of Cornwall Council which is geographically close and has a similar number of electors. Below is a table showing relative levels:

## 5. Implications

5.1 It is the appointed Returning Officer's duty to organise and conduct local elections, and the Electoral Registration Officer the Parliamentary elections.

Responsibility for appointment of the Deputy Returning Officers rests with the Returning Officer.

The Representation of the People Act 1983 makes provision for a scale of expenses to be fixed for the purpose of determining the Returning

Officer's expenditure.

The Council has an annual budget based on equalising the necessary sum for the all-out elections over the four-yearly cycle. This covers any by-elections held during the life of the council and can be adjusted to reflect the inflationary costs during the period, as they arise. There is no need to increase this year's budget to reflect any changes arising from this report.

# 2023 SCALE OF EXPENSES which may be incurred in relation to the Election of Somerset Councillors

#### A - FOR SERVICES OF DEPUTY RETURNING OFFICERS

A maximum of £230.00, for each contested electoral division of Somerset Council, to be distributed among Deputy Returning Officers at the discretion of the Returning Officer. Such sum shall be increased to £350.00 in the event of there being only one contested election on a particular day.

To a Deputy Returning Officer separately appointed by the Somerset Returning Officer for the counting of the votes and declaration of result at a contested electoral division, a fee of £60.00 for the first election plus £30.00 for each additional contested electoral division.

#### **B - CLERICAL ALLOWANCES**

#### 1. Contested Election

A Clerical allowance of £350.00 for each contested election of a Somerset Councillor, provided that such fee shall be increased to £470 in the case of a Deputy acting for not more than one election on the same day.

#### 2. Uncontested Election

A Clerical allowance of £100.00 for each uncontested election.

- 6. For each Polling Station Inspector to include all expenses other than any travelling expenses authorised by this scale £300. In addition for attending compulsory training an expense of £35 is paid.
- 7. Travelling expenses of the Returning Officer, Deputy Returning Officers and those employed by the Returning Officer and DRO other than election day staff.
